Item summary	1. School updates
NO vote needed	<p>Notes: It's a busy time with many events: Dine and Donate (which was at Chick-Fil-A and was awesome), Starstruck practice each week (performances on November 3rd), fall carnival on October 28th, the IB parade on Halloween, all the Halloween class parties, and we have minimum days coming up for student led conferences. We are different from the rest of the district as our conferences are student led and having them in November gives us an extra month to be prepared. A sign-up genius will be sent soon by Tammy Consulo to the whole school at once. Parents can reach out if time slots don't work for them. School safety is an extra big focus this year. New this year are locked classroom doors, volunteers MUST come into office (extra watchful of this), teachers have the same lanyards, staff trained on ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) training that started in August district wide and then will have additional site-specific training. This training started rolling out a few years back, but then covid happened and now we can bring it back. A district wide email will be coming out today about it. Parents can review and ask questions, the goal is to prepare and NOT scare, drill, but not be caught off guard, teach kids it is safe here and the things we do to make it safe. We have monthly drills, and each month is a different type of drill. We will have another IB night if enough people sign-up – only 2 responses so far. The night will be geared towards people thinking about possibly coming to our school and will be the same presentations as last time. Kindergarten applications due in November for next school year. Notes: Jog A Thon was on October 6 and was super fun, exciting and successful with so much parent involvement. This is not just a fundraiser, but a community event. We raised more money than expected, over \$44k raised through jogathon, between sponsorships & pledges with a \$30k goal. Kids will get free popsicle for beating goals, individual prizes, Watch DOGS lunch today for those who beat the DOG, prizes passed out last Friday and random drawings. On Monday the top 10 earners get Chick Fil A lunch with Mrs. Brink. Students will be recognized for all sorts of accomplishments. Fall Carnival is week from today – this has been advertised, please read email sent yesterday with FAQ, keep pushing, there will be a big surge in last minute webstore sales, wrist bands sold at door day of CASH ONLY, frozen in time here – we get kickback, MYP will be selling pizza, popcorn, and cotton candy as MYP fieldtrips fundraiser (CASH ONLY). Candice Smith helped with Jog A Thon and Erin Russo is helping with carnival, Big thanks to PTC, LBCS staff, and Watch DOGS for Chick Fil A dine and donate. CFA donates prizes and all raffle money goes to us PLUS 20% of all food sales – 2nd biggest ever \$716.25 in 3 hrs at CFA, total Dine and Donate goal was \$2k last year and we made \$4k, this year goal is \$3k and we are close to halfway to our goal right now. Chipotle next on November 9th and that should be big, some other big ones in spring (Taylors, CFA and Chipotle), we fill in with others to support local Loomis places. **Watch DOG UPDATE: Brandon and Kevin** – trying to get dads more involved in other things not just being on campus, now they have carnival booth, Kevin suggested they should do poker night – NON PTC EVENT – clubhouse rented at Lakeview Estates in Granite Bay – reserved by pony baseball president, goal is to have 60 people should have \$8-10k raised – will be held Dec 3rd, buy in \$100, rebuy \$25, cornhole tournament for non-winners to get to finals, looking for donations if anyone wants to donate prizes for winners (Kevin is donating his condo) – Kevin is trying to get approval for grass/turf in the dirt that isn't school property that they let us play on – Kevin has people that can put this in (poker night can sponsor this) – Kyle Green made flier – pass out fliers and get word out somehow (not through Tammy). Possible Top Golf/bowling night for families not just dads in the Spring. – **Lorena Brink: LOVES OUR Watch DOGS.** It is nice to have male positive connections on campus, other schools say we are the shining star of the Watch DOG program, THANK YOU DOGS. LBEF events coming up – fundraising activities coming up – supports all Loomis by giving \$7,500 grant that the LBEF approves. Through them this grant will fund bringing back 4th day of Spanish. TOAST (Taste of a Small Town) is tomorrow – tickets available, MANDA RUN weekend before Thanksgiving – ALL Loomis community welcome – don't have to be runner, family friendly, biggest fundraiser, competition between all Loomis schools to get MANDA CUP (we have never won this YET) – please register (counts towards our winning). Holiday home tour is a Saturday in December coming up, support because it all comes back to our schools, LBEF did chalk welcome messages at schools in beginning of year. Room parents and teachers should have sent out your time, PTC sent out times yesterday as well. PTC FULLY FUNDING THIS EVENT THIS YEAR, able to do this due to generosity of our community and fundraising, going to do a better job of budgeting this going forward. Last year it was new so we had to charge for tickets as we were able to secure this after the budget was approved. Last year were covid restrictions of only immediate family, this year no restrictions, but gym has fire marshal limit, please limit to 3-4 family members if possible.
