**Update from Director and/or Teacher Representative**

Item summary	1. School updates
NO vote needed	<p>Notes: Ramping up to get busy on campus. 6<sup>th</sup> graders were supposed to go to Donner pass next week, pushed back to April 20<sup>th</sup> due to storms, still will have snow! 4<sup>th</sup> graders going to CODS in 2 weeks (haven't done since covid). 5<sup>th</sup> grade has walk throughs next week and then exhibition coming up. 8<sup>th</sup> grade is gearing up for capstone projects. Kids do two types of presentations. Tedtalk style and science project type. Kids pick on own and mentors guide them. CAASPP state testing coming up in May. Teachers may request parents to bring in breakfast items for kids to perk up the week, we don't want kids stressing out about test scores. Music docent – working with district to bring it back next year – if not all grades, then alternate each year with art one year and music the next. Working with facilities for a place to do it (elementary is easy, but middle school with band is harder). Franklin is being SO supportive letting us use their music room AND instruments. Kit Abele is doing amazing, and kids love it. Positive to see and makes us more committed to bring back going forward. Will there be after school grant funding for next year? No, we exhausted money (plus a bit extra) and won't be back next year. Now that we have relationships with these after school vendors, next year we can talk to them and see if they want to come back and then parents can choose to pay if they want their kids to participate. We can look into scholarships for kids who want to participate but can't afford it. ESPORTS district tournament yesterday – really cool, so fun, music, lights, competitive and kids were into it and chanting LBCS, supporting all teams and got to go on stage. Will continue next year – it is cheaper when it is something staff members can do instead of brining someone else in. Ms. Magorian spearheaded this. Each year bring a new grade to it so current kids can continue to do it.</p>

4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>, then 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>/ 6<sup>th</sup>, then 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> etc. Two 6 graders made it to county level for spelling bee!

Do we know about positions for next year staffing/changes? – Be patient. Not planning on shifting teachers from grade level. Board agenda if teacher resigns and that’s how public finds out. Newsletter at end of year. Will need part time music/art teachers.

Gentle nudge to remind parents to pull forward to turf at pick-up as traffic backs-up on Laird. Will communicate to parents next week and monitor.
