	<p>Parent questions are discussed if any are received. Public comments are taken at this time.</p> <p>Two since last meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Our classroom sizes are the largest in the Loomis Union school district. Are we able to modify our charter and reduce the number of students from 26 to 22 for K through third? And from 30 to 26 for fourth through eighth? Historically this is what the school started at number wise. If we aren’t able to do that, are we able to add an aid to float from room to room to help alleviate our large class sizes?” <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ This feedback was sent to Mrs. Newton for further discussion. Class sizes were slightly increased due to funding adjustments. In previous years, we have attempted to hire an aide, but unfortunately, no applicants applied. • “I just want to thank PTC for EVERYTHING that you do for our school community! The school carnival was incredible, a truly wonderful community event for LBCS families and I know that countless hours and thought went into creating this experience.
